A Message from Rev. Jeff MacDonald

Dear NVC members & friends,

Lent has arrived and will be with us through April 3. So what will it mean this year for us to repent and believe the good news?

This is a perfect season for processing what NVC has been through. From pastoral transitions to suspension of in-person services, it's been a lot. We might need some time to ponder this measure of change. That's exactly what Lent gives us: a long time to reflect, to be honest with ourselves, to confront what's been hard yet necessary to think about... even to let go of stumbling blocks that might stand in our way. Clinging to safety blankets can sometimes be a hindrance, such as when it's time to swim.

I encourage you in this Lent to do some deep reflecting while also trusting deeply in the merciful ways of God. If something has disrupted your routines of worship, prayer, Bible reading, Christian fellowship or service to the community, ask how you might restore those habits by using new forms or methods that can work even in a pandemic. Be creative, try experimenting, don't fret a setback or two. And all the while, ponder which emotional attachments might be getting in the way of what's most important to your life as a

Christian. Then take a first step to realign.

The journey to the Cross and beyond involves following a Savior who wants our whole hearts, not just a portion. "Whoever does not take up their cross and follow me is not worthy of me," Jesus tells the disciples in Matthew 10:38. He also assures them that the kingdom is already at hand (Mark 1:15). May this special Lent be marked for us by a special measure of courage and grace.

RECEIVING COMMUNION

Beginning on March 7, 2021 the Nahant Village Church will be administering Communion, in person, after the prerecorded worship service. During the prerecorded worship, the elements will be consecrated with one or more deacons present in the chapel. As people view the worship on Sunday, they will be taken thru the preparatory steps such as confession and assurance of forgiveness. People may come to the Nahant Village Church, between 11:15–12:00 noon, for a drive-thru receiving of Communion. Deacons hand the prepackaged Communion set to each person in the car. Communicants then ingest the elements on the spot and return the empty containers to a hand-held receptacle that the Deacon will make available.

We will prepare collectively to receive the elements. Just like when we do Communion at church, no one is permitted to take the elements home and ingest later; we all receive simultaneously. Everyone is served by someone else, which is an important symbol of our servanthood as Christ's followers. And finally, the elements are handled with reverence.

Also, for those who are not comfortable coming to the church, Communion can be brought to their homes. I think the recipient should come to the door to receive. If that is too much of a close encounter for your safety, then they should abstain from Communion until after the pandemic, which is honorable & fine to do. For people who choose to come to the church to receive Communion we must follow COVID guidelines. Everyone will stay in their car. All people in the car, must wear a mask when the Deacon approaches the car. You will be passed a prepackaged Communion packet. You will wait to take your mask off until the Deacon is safely away from your car, at which time, you can take off your mask and consume the elements. Once everyone has finished with the elements, we ask that everyone in the car put their mask back on, and a Deacon will come back to the car to collect the wrapping and juice cups.

We are excited to be able to see you and offer you Communion in-person on the first Sunday of each month.
