



NVC IN ACTION

FROM THE TRUSTEES

The Trustees of the Nahant Village Church have continued to monitor the progress of the handicap accessible project. There have been some delays along the way, but access to the Sanctuary entrance is now complete.

The contractors hoped that the next phase would be a relative breeze, but have encountered surprises and obstacles, including a concrete base of at least two feet in thickness in front of the companionway doors. That required bringing in additional equipment to break up the mass and once that was out of the way, the contractors exposed rot under the front entry caused by years of water infiltration. They are dealing with that now.

Until that is repaired and the walk to the companionway entrance is complete, access to the church is through the doors at the Narthex and the entrance on the North side of the building.

Thanks are due to Lynne Spencer, and Cal and Marrit Hastings for expediting payments to the contractors, and also to Cal for unlocking the side door in the mornings.

Thanks also for your patience and support during this project.



Work on the second entrance hit a bit of a snag when about two feet of cement was discovered just outside the companionway doorway.

Among the other items we have considered at recent Trustees meetings are solar electric panels on the flat roof and outdoor lighting for the front of the church. Plans are also in place now for our annual Stewardship campaign.




