Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

It is with much joy and excitement that I write this my first pastor's note for the Pulpit Rock! Shortly after this newsletter goes out, we will share our first Sunday worship together on February 12th as we begin ministry together in the dynamic Nahant Village Church on the spectacular peninsula of Nahant. I am joyful and excited for a number of reasons. One is because this note being drafted and published means we are almost together in what has paradoxically seemed like both a long wait and a quick happening. Nancy and I visited and met with you way back in mid-October when autumn was just getting underway and front yards in Nahant had only just sprouted Halloween decor. Since then, Halloween, Thanksgiving, Advent, Christmas, New Years and MLK holidays have all rolled on by -- and yet it's barely been three-and-half months. During that time Nancy and I have scurried to put our house on the market, sell it, pack and move, wrap up the Ohio ministry and say good-bye to a good church full of good people doing good work in Ohio.

I am also joyful and excited because not only does being in Nahant bring us closer to our daughter Tristan in Vermont, it brings us back near the ocean with a progressive church, a church that after many conversations with the search team, the conference and many of you I am convinced is also a good church full of good people doing good work in Nahant with God by your side. We gave careful and prayerful consideration to all of the above as we discerned God calling us to Nahant Village Church -and has done so beyond a reasonable doubt!

Once we arrive, I will want to hear from all of you about the church and ideas you have for the future. As it is right now, I have discerned five important things that I hope we can start right away--with lots of support. First, from what I am told, we need a new set of bylaws for the 21st century. I agree that new bylaws are needed right away for the church to accomplish the many things I've heard NVC hopes to do, Bylaws are a must. I understand there has been a lot of headway already with the Bylaws Team and I look forward to working with them and the rest of you to complete the task in the weeks ahead.

I also learned that there is interest in creating a summer peace camp for the local children, I have past experience in that regard, but it can only be done with lots of help from volunteers willing to serve as directors, teachers, snack providers and adult supervisors along with teen and college age counselors. The program I am familiar with and highly recommend is an interfaith community peace camp called Peace Village. (You can find out more about Peace Village at this link: http://

peacevillageglobal.org/)

After Ash Wednesday I also hope to start offering opportunities for local discussion of progressive theology with classes held on a weeknight at the church.

I plan to start with a six weeklong Lenten class that discusses the remarkable book *The Last Week* by John Dominic Crossan and Marcus Borg (see details on page 3). After Easter my thought is to continue the progressive theology outreach by mixing it with justice work holding a late spring six-week discussion on racism using the book *America's Original Sin* by Evangelical pastor Jim Wallis. These outreach projects are already in the works, however, I would like your thoughts on them and especially on a summer long weekly talks about God where we just meet to discuss questions and ideas about God (this includes religion, church, Jesus, the Bible, etc. etc.). I have led discussions on both books and Talks About God (TAG) in the past and have found them to be well attended and appreciated. Early on in my discussions with the Pastoral Search Committee I understood that the first church services that grew into NVC were first held in the summer of 1821. Since we are just now coming out of the pandemic it seems 2023 is a good time to pick up the ball and celebrate 200 years of church in Nahant. We can include the peace camp and classes noted above as a part of the celebration, but I am hoping we can form a committee of people interested in local church history to also highlight NVC history in The Pulpit Rock, in Sunday bulletins, and maybe even with short 200-year anniversary moments on Sundays and a community event or two.

Finally, I have heard that community theatre has been a part of Nahant's history. I have been involved in theatre ministries for decades and would love to discuss the idea of starting one in the next year or so at NVC. I have a background that includes full scale work on dramas, musicals, and Shakespeare so this is a ministry we could do serious work with if enough people are interested. In Ohio a ministry like this I led raised over \$100,000 for a local homeless shelter as it connected youth to the community through the performing arts -- so it can be quite a substantial ministry.

Thanks for reading this far into my first NVC pastor's note.

I hope you can tell I really am very excited about this call and about working with you all on things like the projects I mention above as well others we develop and work together on with God beside us.

I will see you all in just a few weeks!




