WHAT'S GOING ON

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Since there will be no 2023report for the pastor at the Nahant Village Church Annual Meeting on May 21 I thought I'd take a moment to at least sum up my first quarter of the year here in 2023. I officially began as the full time minister on February 11, 2023. The goal was to get here by Lent, we did and we hit the ground running with a powerful Ash Wednesday service and a well attended and lively six week discussion on "The Last Week," a book about Holy Week by Marcus Borg and John Dominic Crossan. (The discussion went so well another one is being planned for May/June around a very informative book called "Remedial Christianity: What Every Believer Should Know About the Faith, but Probably Doesn't" by Paul Laughlin).

During Lent images of Christ that I have collected over the years were put on display in the Narthex by Amy and Chris just in time forPalm Sunday and we had an uplifting service with wonderful music provided by the bell

choir, the vocal choir, a gifted trumpeter, Cheryl; and the music was planned by the music committee and led by our hard working Music Director .Bill.

Palm Sunday was followed by a moving Maundy Thursday service with a great congregational reading of Mark's texts and exceptional solos by Amy and Cal, keyboard by Bill- and a dramatic reading of the role of Jesus by Rev. Teri. Then on Easter NVC hosted a beautiful sunrise service, a delicious Easter breakfast, an egg hunt and a powerful Easter service with colorful flowers, nice readings by Rachel, and great music by the bell choir, the vocal choir, Rich and Michael with Bill again heading all that music up. (Make sure to thank Bill for his Holy Week work!)

In addition to Lenten work, Sunday services, Holy Week and Easter preparation, the past three months I have also attended numerous meetings with NVC church leaders as we get underway in our ministry together. I have had a great exchange of emails and an in-person meeting with North Shore Community College leadership discussing how we might work together on Peace Village and other forms of building the community up. I also met with the Nahant Council on Aging leadership to discuss possible uses of our building and resources to connect with them and help. I have had meetings with local UCC clergy and conversations with the Northeast Association of the Southern New England Conference of the United Church of Christ. (The UCC has been extremely supportive!). I've also started connecting with local theatre

participating in community discussions and a reading of "Our Town" put on by the library.

For the summer, Jen and Chris and I have also been focusing on plans for a new children's summer camp, Peace Village and we've gathered a couple of times with a number of others interested in helping and planning the program. This Friday, May 5th at the Community Breakfast I will be talking about Peace Village and our plans and how folks can help. A half dozen of us have also started working on putting together a 200th Anniversary celebration of church in Nahant.

I have also been involved in working with volunteers, church leaders and staff regarding a myriad of issues and ideas including the above, as well as publicity, signage, music, summer worship, summer discussions, needed changes, building use, building upkeep, bylaws, leadership, updating membership rolls, office manager, office hours, bulletin boards, and preparation for the annual meeting. Almost everyone at NVC has greeted and treated me with kindness and hospitality and respect, which I've appreciated. All of this gives me hope that NVC can experience a renaissance—indeed the church seems to already be growing as many have stepped forward to help animate the Body of Christ in our community—that should be good news for us all.

ALL IN THE FAMILY

For the May 7 communion service, we welcome organist Bill Thompson's twin brother, Dr. Robert Thompson, of Corvallis, Oregon. Bob has a long history of accomplishments including a Fulbright Scholarship to study organ in Germany with the noted Helmut Walcha and earning a doctorate in organ performance from University of Michigan.

He was a member of the St. Olaf College (MN) faculty for many years and has served various churches as Choirmaster/Organist.

Bob will play the prelude Sunday, May 7 and will perform "Turo", a hymn he composed, for the postlude. Every hymn has a name for the tune it is based on. A given hymn may appear with different texts and under differing titles. "Turo," composed by Robert Thompson, is one such hymn. It appears in the black hymnal, #117 as "Lift Up Your Heads, O Mighty Gates," which dates back to 1641and was composed by Georg Weisel.

dinner. Enjoy chicken or beef tacos with all the fixings, coleslaw, ice cream and even a mock-a-rita!


Donations will kindly be accepted and will go to support Peace Village, a four-day camp for kids in grades 1-6 planned to take place here in Nahant, in August.



NVC IN ACTION

Trustees Actions in April

- *Approved the acquisition and installation of an A/C unit to be placed over the Companionway entry door. This will provide relief of the heat in the church office and hallways, but also provide some cooling in the chapel and Swansburg Hall with appropriately placed fans.
- *Buildings and Grounds has begun making plans for restoration work at the front of the church. Some of this work may need to be delayed until the walkway renovations have been completed.
- *Received notification from National Grid that the church will receive reimbursement in full for costs incurred to fix plumbing problems at the parsonage caused by a severed pipe.
- *Approved an agreement with Gotta Know Media to rent one of the basement classrooms. Christine Stevens is one of the three principals in this newly formed company. Since last year, the former children's chapel has been rented out for a furniture refurbishing business.
