INTERIM MINISTER'S CORNER

Be the Church: Encouragement from Our Departing Interim Minister

Dear members and friends of Nahant Village Church,



As you might have heard, my ministry among you will end August 31 when my contract with Nahant Village Church expires. Rather than accept a new two-month contract for 10 hours per week, as proposed by the church, I opted to focus instead on work I do for a variety of clients in the areas of consulting, ministry and writing.

With each transition comes opportunity to reposition and take a fresh approach. As NVC begins its search for a new pastor, I encourage you to keep a few guiding principles in mind.

Be engaged. NVC has in the past relied too heavily on a pastor to single-handedly deliver results, such as increasing membership, without robustly claiming the role that all congregants are called to have in deepening faith practices, sharing the Good News and making disciples. Know yourselves as faith practitioners, not religious consumers, and you'll not only impact the world for the better. You'll also find the peace and joy that comes with dedication to the Way of Jesus.

Be visionary. The congregation – not the pastor, not the governing board – carries decision-making authority to

set direction for a local church in the United Church of Christ (UCC). The congregation should participate early in identifying NVC's values, priorities and strengths; and in charting a course. The board and pastor are charged with helping the congregation execute its own, God-inspired vision. They can't do that unless the congregation takes time to prayerfully discern a vision and make it known to lay and ordained leaders. I urge you to carve out time and space for this ongoing work of visioning.

Be advocates. With power comes responsibility. In the church, that means members must not merely lobby for their own personal preferences. They must consider what the wider community needs from the only Protestant Christian church in Nahant and carry that banner into settings where decisions are made. As you exercise this level of spiritual maturity, you'll grow in conviction, clarity and purpose.

Be accountable. Just as eating a healthy diet requires restraint and nourishes the physical body, church discipline involves embracing boundaries that allow the spiritual body to flourish. NVC has not been disciplined about living by its bylaws, raising up new lay leaders or clarifying what it means to be a church member. Neglecting church discipline might feel liberating for a while, but like a diet with no limits, it becomes debilitating and heightens stress over time. NVC needs to break its habit of avoiding accountability mechanisms. -ContinuedTrue freedom is found by embracing healthy limits, which lead to clear expectations and mutual understandings.

Be covenantal. As a UCC congregation, NVC is part of a denomination with supports and codes to foster healthy church life. I urge you to lean in and trust in this wisdom. Seek an ordained, experienced clergyperson who can rightly administer the sacraments,

bring theological training to bear and be accountable – not only to the congregation but also to a network of churches collaborating to ensure quality of leadership. Don't be tempted to maximize flexibility by jettisoning standards. Hold yourselves to a meaningful bar so that the

blessings of the wider Christian tradition of which we are a part can again take root and grow.

Thank you for the opportunity to minister among you in this strange, pandemic time. I'm grateful that I could get to know many of you and wish it could have been more. Though

the virus often prevented us from being together in person, we've nonetheless shared a meaningful journey. We've been blessed. May the Holy Spirit give you clarity and courage for the portion that lies ahead.

He gives advice to

But now, we hope to come fully back to church for the traditional 'Rally Sunday'. It is time to get back with 'it'. What is 'it'? Well, to enjoy the Sabbath by coming to church to worship and praise your Creator. Then, with the help of the Holy Spirit, to follow the commands of His Son to help feed the hungry, clothe the naked, visit the sick and those in prison. And, above all, to love one another, starting in your own home, in your daily routine, and those you do not yet know.

To help focus our worship, our readings and discussions will use those readings in the Lectionary. The Lectionary is the manual that assigns various scripture readings to each day of the week. It may seem helter-skelter but, over a few years, if you read each reading, you will read most of the New Testament and much of the Hebrew Scriptures. Do not be overwhelmed, focus first on just the Sunday readings (and be warned that I will not always use each reading!). Please use it to prepare your hearts to not only come to worship aware of what will be read, but, to strengthen your ability to love and serve one another. And....you know how I like to ask you to participate in the sermon by asking questions? That is another reason to read ahead. One of our goals is to strengthen and teach one another, and not have one person do all the talking. Amen?

Be busy in God's work but remember, our Savior valued time away from the crowds and times for quiet reflection. Make time for prayer before you spread God's Word and Love.

KEEP OUR SUPPORT FOR MY BROTHER'S TABLE STRONG

My Brother's Table in Lynn has been our Church's most important mission outreach. Today problems of hunger and poverty are greater than ever. Approximately 20% of Lynn residents live below the poverty level, and 1 in 5 people are considered food insecure, meaning that they do not have the resources to guarantee adequate access to proper nutrition. My Brother's Table is open 365 days a year and offers free meals to everyone who comes to its door, regardless of race, color, creed, or sex. In 2020 close to 800,000 meals were served.

Who are the guests at My Brother's Table?

- 50% have finished 12 years of schooling
- 70% have a disability
- 60% come to My Brother's Table every day
- 90% have been homeless at least once in their lifetime
- 25% are working or have worked in the past year.

It is important to note that My Brother's Table is funded entirely by private donors and businesses in order to insure the privacy of guests and to serve the greatest number of people in need. The organization does not accept Government grants and is not a United Way affiliate.

Given the tremendous need, we want to continue or, even better, increase our support this year. In the past, it was our tradition to sponsor a meal at My Brother's Table in odd months of the year. The COVID-19 pandemic disrupted this tradition. To compensate for this, the Church last year increased its financial support to \$2,300 -- \$1,500 from contributions made by our parishioners, and \$500 from the Church's general budget.

Starting on the second Sunday in September, we will resume taking a collection in support of My Brother's Table every other month. Thus far, we have collected only \$230 in MBT contributions. So we have a way to go to reach last year's goal. Please open your hearts and wallet or checkbook and contribute generously to this very worthy cause. This is a very concrete way in which we can show our love of our neighbors.

Please make a note in the memo line of your check or on the envelope to indicate that your contribution is to benefit MBT. Thank you in advance for your generosity!
