

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We have been having a wonderful time in our "Gospel According to Hollywood" Lenten class sharing a potluck meal and watching and talking about major motion pictures that depict the story of Jesus. We started out with some silent films and in March we are progressing into the more modern "talkies." The discussions of the films and Jesus' story and God have been deep and fun and full of the Spirit. We have four more movies left and all are welcome to attend and participate. Please consider joining us on Wednesdays at 6 p.m. for dinner, the movies start at 6:30. The rest of the movie line up is: March 6, Jesus Christ SuperStar; March 13, The Gospel According to St. Matthew; March 20, The Miracle Worker: The Story of Jesus; and March 27, Godspell.

At the end of our Lenten services and Lenten class and discussions the Nahant Village Church will make way for Holy Week with services on a Palm/Passion Sunday, Maundy Thursday and Easter. I hope that you will consider attending and sharing in the hope and joy that the first Holy Week and every Holy Week since has offered. Here are more details: On Palm/Passion Sunday (at 10:30am) we will have service in the beautiful sanctuary with greenery, words and music befitting the Holy day. Then from 2 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. we will host an ice cream social for Nahant children & families complete with crafts, a visit with the Easter Bunny and an egg hunt!

On Maundy Thursday (7 p.m.) we will have an evening service in the Narthex as we consider the Gospel of Mark's telling of the Passion story with song, prayers, readings and communion.

Early Easter morning (6:15 a.m.) we will meet in Bob Risch's front yard at 405 Nahant Road and celebrate the rising of the Son with Word and Song and communion in our annual Sunrise Service. Sunrise Service will be followed by our traditional continental breakfast back in Swansburg Hall.

Later Easter Morning a glorious Easter service (10:30 a.m.) filled with special music and flowers, scripture and a sermon, is planned.

As the days get longer and spring shows signs of coming, Nahant itself becomes a place where Awe and Wonder are clearly more visible, giving us glimpses of God virtually everywhere. It's an excellent season to, in addition to our services, take time for the Creator by stopping and noticing and giving thanks, as well as sharing in worship and fellowship in Nahant Village Church services.

A group of volunteers met recently to develop an outline for this year's fundraising events. Each year, when we pass the budget, we do so with the understanding that we will need to do some fundraising to help with the projected shortfall. This year the fundraising goal was set at \$15,000. We are excited about the events we have planned. There are more paint nights, Tides Fundraisers, Bingo Nights, flea markets, concerts and of course our annual Christmas Fair coming our way this year.

Several of these events are what we call a "light lift" meaning that they don't require a lot of volunteers to run the event, such as a paint night or Tides fundraiser. Other events are what we call "Heavy lifts" meaning that they will require many volunteers to make them successful, such as the Flea Market and Christmas Fair. TRUSTEES CORNER

The Trustees met on Tuesday evening, February 13. We reviewed and approved the financial report from the Treasurer, as well as a draft report for the NVC annual report.

We discussed the recently formed Bylaws review committee, and the board felt strongly that the Trustees should be represented on that committee, and approved Rex Antrim to be that representative. Others on that committee are Rev. Scott, Marrit Hastings, Chris Rogers and Carl Jenkins.

We discussed the utility costs at the church and the parsonage. The recent bills were quite high for both gas and electric. We will look into choosing a new supplier which will reduce some of the costs.

The Trustees also resumed the discussion on getting solar electricity panels installed on the flat roof. Previous inquiries through Resonant Energy indicated that we don't use enough electricity at the church to warrant the cost of solar installation, but we can use energy generated to supply the parsonage as well, and also provide help with others in community who need help covering their electric costs. We will follow up on that.

Our next scheduled meeting will be Tuesday, March 12 at 7 p.m.

I will try to post an agenda in advance in an attempt to keep the membership and friends informed.


CHURCH COUNCIL HAPPENINGS


