Dear Church Family-

Christmas. Another year over. A new one just begun. Recognize the words? John Lennon and Yoko Ono. They then ask a simple question... what have you done?



As Christians, we use more than January to reflect on our acts and our hopes. We have Advent and Lent to keep us focused. Through Christ's death on the Cross, we have the ability to no longer live in the past. We have the ability to live in the present and to live knowing our future is secure if we stay on The Way, the term used in the early church to identify the path for Christians.

The 'Breaking News' mentality of ever-present news cycles in print, TV, phone apps, you name it, would have us believe we live in unheralded times. Let me introduce (or remind you about) Martin Rinkart, a priest in a place that is now in Germany but was then in Saxony. Born in 1586, Rinkart lived in Eilenberg, a walled city of insignificant size. What is known as the 'Thirty Year's War' (30 years!) started while he was a Lutheran pastor. For 30 years, the only 'breaking news' was about more homes and fields being burned, more innocent civilians slaughtered and more refugees coming to Eilenberg. Too many. While the Swedish Army had the city under siege, the plague broke out and it is estimated that 5,000 citizens died in one year, including Martin's wife. Martin was the only pastor who lived.

Some days, he performed as many as 50 funerals. Eventually, Martin helped negotiate the sum of money that the Swedish Army accepted to end its siege.

Yet, here is the most amazing part: coming out of those darkest of times, Martin wrote a hymn of thanks and praise that you might hear on Sunday if you walk by a church with its doors open: Now Thank We All Our God.

To remind myself of Martin's story, I entered the search terms 'priest Germany plague 5000 funerals hymn' into Google only to find that one of the suggested further searches was 'how to open a funeral home'. Google and much of our culture only sees, nay, wallows in the negative. There is a reason that we, a people of The Cross, are a people of hope. Out of the darkest days, we see only resurrection possibilities. *In the darkest days of Winter, we see Spring*.

Though we are still not able to sing away in our pews, I urge you to listen to Martin Rinkart's most famous hymn and weave these words into your heart and life: *O may this bounteous God through all our life be near us, with ever joyful hearts and blessed peace to cheer us, to keep us in his grace, and guide us when perplexed, and free us from all ills of this world in the next.* Go, listen (https://youtu.be/ iLjJJBFIXR0) and be filled with love for God and one another!

Yesterday, I visited with John, Youngae, and Andrew. Joe died at 4:00 a.m. at home under hospice care. The family plans to have a Memorial Service in the Spring at the NVC. It would be helpful for the family members if we could check in with Joe's wife, Youngea, for comfort and support. Olivia, Samantha, Betsy, and others have been over-the-top supportive for a long time. Cards and calls are also welcomed. The family will choose a charity for donations. Right now they are all set with food, and other material needs.

Thank you for the honor of overseeing the pastoral needs of the church.



#### COMPASSIONATE CARE CIRCLE




