

JUST THE FACTS ABOUT PEACE VILLAGE

When & where is Peace Village?

Peace Village will be held Aug. 14-18 from 9:30 a.m. - 3 p.m. at Flash Road Playground. On the last afternoon, Aug. 18, families are invited to the closing celebration! How Much does it cost?

Peace Village is generously funded through resources provided by NVC. Families are asked to contribute a \$25 donation per child to help cover costs. If you are able to give more, we will gratefully receive it. If the cost is a hardship, scholarships are available.

Who are Peace Village participants?

Peace Village is available to 30 kids who must be rising 1-6 graders. We expect to have a Buddhist, Jewish, Muslim and Christian teachers. Children of all religious/spiritual traditions are encouraged to apply. Registrations are accepted on a first come, first serve basis starting May 15.

Who are the leaders?

Representatives from NVC, college peace workers, as well as interfaith representatives will supervise children attend activities and lead peace related classes, circle gatherings, song and stories. College & high school youth are expected to shepherd small groups of children & stay with them throughout the day.

What about lunch and snacks?

Children are expected to bring their own lunch each day and enjoy time for talking, eating & playing. Healthy morning snacks will be provided. (Note: If there is an economic need we can provide lunch for a child.)

WHAT DO CHILDREN LEARN AT PEACE VILLAGE?

Your children will learn about “Peace & the Planet (environment, ecology, nature); Peace & Our Culture” (responsible thinking, media literacy & compassionate communication); “Peace With Others” (non-violent problem solving, role playing & peace advocacy) and “Peace within Self” (centering, calming the mind & body and meditation). There will also be singing, story telling, art projects, nature walks and outdoor games!
