Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

These days the beauty of creation is a constant theme in my head

and a number of newsletters and sermons too, because every single day on Nahant is full of breathtaking views. You can look up, down and all around and there are stunning sights to see all year round. This fact made me forget how much spring's annual unfurling of greenery and blossoms adds a whole other layer of attractiveness to this sparkling gem of geography. Just a week or so ago the pink petals on the blossoms of the tree in the front of the church took my breath away as I arrived for work after a week on vacation. And when I got inside the garth also gave me pause as I laid eyes on the flowers in full bloom around the brick way.

It's not just plants, of course, colorful birds have returned dotting the sky and trees with an array of color and sizes and whistles and calls. Rabbits are seemingly everywhere and I've spotted more than one pretty predator eyeing them and their bushy tailed neighbor, the squirrels. Even the waves in the sea seem to don a vernal hue edged with foam as they endlessly glisten in the longer rays of the sun. I actually find myself humming and whistling and singing a bit more in the presence of so much beauty, so much of God.

There is a long psalm, Psalm 104, that reminds me of spring here in Nahant and

how it makes me feel. Here are just some of the verses (1-13) from Eugene Peterson's The Message (a modern paraphrase of the Bible):

O my soul, bless God! O my God, how great you are! beautifully, gloriously robed, Dressed up in sunshine, and all heaven stretched out for your tent. You built your palace on the ocean deeps, made a chariot out of clouds and took off on wind-wings. You commandeered winds as messengers, appointed fire and flame as ambassadors. You set earth on a firm foundation so that nothing can shake it, ever. You blanketed earth with ocean, covered the mountains with deep waters; Then you roared and the water ran away— your thunder crash put it to flight. Mountains pushed up, valleys spread out in the places you assigned them. You set boundaries between earth and sea; never again will earth be flooded. You started the springs and rivers, sent them flowing among the hills. All the wild animals now drink their fill, wild donkeys quench their thirst. Along the riverbanks the birds build nests, ravens make their voices heard. You water the mountains from your heavenly reservoirs; earth is supplied with plenty of water. (continued)



Toward the very end of Psalm 104 there are these words that capture the musical feelings Nahant in the spring brings about:

Oh, let me sing to God all my life long, sing hymns to my God as long as I live! Oh, let my song please him; I'm so pleased to be singing to God. ..O my soul, bless God!



May all of you have a wonderful spring, so wonderful it makes you sing.

The church has been a busy place the last couple of months with the Lenten Season, business matters, and social activities. I am writing today to take a minute to invite you to our Annual Meeting scheduled for May 19, 2024, immediately following worship. We have four pieces of business to address during the meeting.

First, we will vote to accept the Annual Report for the year 2023. Each Board and Committee has written a summary of their activities and work throughout the 2023 year. They are available for your review, so if you haven't received one, please let Chris Steven know.

Our Second piece of business will be to vote on the nomination presented to us by the Nomination Committee to appoint and fill openings for Board and Committee members.

Tuesday May 14, 11 a.m.





FROM THE TRUSTEES

See what the Trustees are_up to

The Trustees met on Tuesday, April 9 and considered a proposal from Resonant Energy for installing solar panels on the flat roof over Swansburg Hall. This has been reviewed by some one in the community and he will be helping us get other proposals, hopefully at a more favorable cost.

For now, the three electric accounts have a new supplier which will result in some savings. We have two accounts at the church, one for the Sanctuary and one for the newer structure, and another account for the Parsonage.

We will be dealing with some lighting and electric issues at the Parsonage.

Exterior projects at the church include leaking in the Sanctuary windows, for which we have an approved contract.

Other repairs include leaking windows in the companionway, slate roof and steeple repair, rotted exterior on the back of the chapel, and rebuilding the egress on the North side near the bathroom hall. The contractors for the exterior accessibility project have worked through their punch list and we will process their final payment once it is approved by the architect.

The Trustees reviewed the proposed ByLaw amendments and recommended some changes, with some suggested edits from lawyers for the Dissolution clause.


