Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

I am writing this as the Winter Solstice, the darkest day of the year, approaches. When the newsletter arrives in early January ten or so longer days with more light will have been added to our days. Happy New Year! But, also surprise! It's still Christmas season until January 6th – so you Merry Christmas just one last time. Here's a cool Christmas time fact, the Twelve Days of Christmas begin just after the darkest day of the year as Christmas Day heralds the dawning of the light both symbolically in Christ and literally for us in the Northern Hemisphere. Every year for millions of years the deepest darkest time on earth has always given way to days with more and more time of light.

The Twelve days of Christmas each add more light, and then just about half-way through those days we celebrate New Years, a cultural time of reflection on the past and a letting go of it too as we move into the fresh new light and promise of new days. A new

year is born again. It is fair to understand this as symbolic of how Christians are "born again," a phrase that often gets misunderstood or misused as a believing a certain form of Christianity in a certain way. But that is not what "born again" in the Bible means, it is something more akin to the New Year's reflections and letting go and moving into the Light of Christ to make ourselves and the world better not by belief, but by love in action. When we get onto Jesus' Way we let go of old ways and become new people, trying to be love in a world (very much in need of it).

As we all move into more and more light this year both cosmically and as individuals, may we strive to do all that God requires of us. The Book of Micah for twenty-five hundred years has taught that God requires just three things, that we seek justice; love kindness and walk humbly with God. May the light of love grow in us each day in this new year as we aim to do those three things.




