Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

I arrived here a year ago! It was cold and snowy, but ever so beautiful. The sight and sounds and smells of the ocean filled our senses. After nine years in the Midwest it was good just to be back near the sea. Even in the cold we walked about Nahant when we arrived just to take in as much of it as possible. Nancy has since walked all over the island and I've walked and ridden my bike throughout the charming town as well.

I often take a camera with me when I go out and about in Nahant. I like to take photos. I think of it as capturing moments of Awe and Wonder; that is to say for me in the moments I focus on picture-taking I find glimpses of God. It's not that I conjure up God (everywhere we go there is God) but that I look for what we often are distracted from finding, i.e., God in every nook and cranny. Nahant makes it much easier to do this. It is full to the brim with easy to see Awe and

Wonder. But even so it often takes a conscious effort to experience it.

With the very generous Christmas gift from the church I bought a new camera. Thank you so much for that present! I love it. It helps me take better pictures and sometimes I actually take a really nice one. I am, though, very much an amateur (I hope one day to take a course). While it is fun and rewarding to see a nice result now and then, mostly it's the sport of the hunt and the glimpses of God that have me doing this.



Photography compels me to take time to look and search and find Awe and Wonder. I always find it. And so I love it.

Often this winter I've been up before dawn and hiking up to East Point to take in flame colored sunrises. Even more often I have been at The Wharf or Baily's Hill or Doggy Beach taking in blazing sunsets in the crisp cool



wind chilled air. I've also been walking or riding in midday on my weekends hunting the Awe and Wonder of the Divine in Nahant. Obviously you can hunt and find it without a camera

This Lent I have decided to give up not hunting for it everyday, in other words I plan to spend time every day that I can between Ash Wed and Easter looking for the Awe and Wonder of God in nature on Nahant. Maybe I'll see some of you out there looking too. If I do, don't be surprised if I snap your picture, because the Awe and Wonder of God can be found in all of you too.

And thank you to all who contributed to our annual White Christmas initiative. As you can see, it is greatly appreciated by all!


THE GOSPEL ACCORDING TO HOLLYWOOD

A Lenten Movie & Discussion Series

The plan is to have a potluck dinner from 6 p.m. - 6:30 p.m. with discussion of the movie we saw the previous week. The first week we will discuss parts of the gospels that mean the most to us and what parts we think film makers will emphasize. The last week, those who wish, can stick around late and chat about the final film after its showing.

As we watch the movies keep these questions in mind (and any others that come up):

- * What sense of Jesus, God and/or the Spirit did you get? Do you think it was the same as what the first viewers felt?
- * What did you think about the portrayal of Jesus, God and/or the Spirit and how other Biblical people and the times were portrayed?
- * What was your favorite part of the movie(s) and why?
- * What was your least favorite part and why?
- * What did you think of the depiction of miracles?
- * What sense of God did the film maker seem to be portraying and how was it the similar and different from the other films we watched?
- * Has the story evolved/changed in film and in our culture in the past 100+ years?



2024 LENTEN SERIES SCHEDULE



During each movie think about the above questions and others you might have for our discussions.

February 21: Potluck meal with opening discussion then at 6:30 p.m we will watch two silent films: *The Life and Passion of Jesus Christ* (1905) and *From the Manger to the Cross* (1912).

February 28: Potluck meal and discussion about the two silent movies from the previous week. At 6:30pm we will watch the shorter (112 min) 1928 release of the Cecil B DeMille silent film *The King of Kings*.

March 6: Potluck and discussion relating to last week's film. At 6:30 p.m. we'll watch the 1973 film adaptation of the rock opera *Jesus Christ Super Star* (107 min).

March 13: Potluck at 6 where we'll discuss our questions (see above) above relating to last week's film. At 6:30 p.m. we will watch a colorized version of the 1964 film *The Gospel According to St.*Matthew (93 min).

March 20: Potluck meal and discussion will start at 6 followed by viewing the 2000 film *The Miracle Worker: The Story of Jesus*.

March 27: Our last class – Potluck and discussion at 6 p.m. then we'll watch the 1973 film adaptation of the Broadway musical *Godspell* (102 min). Since this is our last class, those would like to stay for 30 minutes after the film for discussion time, are welcome to do so.




